



The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health [plan](#). The SBC shows you how you and the [plan](#) would share the cost for covered health care services. Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall deductible ?	Network: \$0 Individual / \$0 Family Non-Network: \$250 Individual / \$750 Family Per calendar year.	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from providers up to the deductible amount before this plan begins to pay. If you have other family members on the plan , each family member must meet their own individual deductible until the total amount of deductible expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family deductible .
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible ?	Categories with a copay are covered before you meet your deductible .	This plan covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the annual deductible amount. But a copayment or coinsurance may apply.
Are there other deductibles for specific services?	No.	You don't have to meet deductibles for specific services.
What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan ?	Network: \$0 Individual / \$0 Family Non-Network: \$1,000 Individual / \$1,000 Family Per calendar year.	The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this plan , they have to meet their own out-of-pocket limits until the overall family out-of-pocket limit has been met.
What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit ?	Premiums , balance-billing charges, health care this plan doesn't cover and penalties for failure to obtain Prenotification for services.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit .
Will you pay less if you use a network provider ?	Yes. This plan uses network providers . If you use a non-network provider your cost may be more. This plan uses a provider network . You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network . You will pay the most if you use an out-of-network provider , and you might receive a bill from a provider for the difference between the provider's charge and what your plan pays (balance billing). Be aware, your network provider might use an out-of-network provider for some services (such as lab work). Check with your provider before you get services.
Do you need a referral to see a specialist ?	No.	You can see the specialist you choose without a referral .

Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? This plan or policy **does not provide** minimum essential coverage. This plan has maintained “Grandfathered” status. Therefore, the minimum essential benefit provisions do not apply.

If you don’t have [Minimum Essential Coverage](#) for a month, you’ll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month.

Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards?). This health coverage **does meet** the minimum value standard for the benefits it provides.
